# From the Desk of Police Chief Terry Kim



As this is the last issue of *The Source* for 2017, I want to take this opportunity to provide a few highlights of the year and share some of the outstanding work from the men and women of the La Palma Police Department. This year our Department implemented several crime prevention strategies to help address the increase in property crimes. We continue to work very hard to keep our response time low, which is consistently around three minutes for Priority One calls. Having one of the fastest if not the fastest for service at our schools,

response times in the Southern California region provides a greater chance for our officers to catch suspects in the act or locate them before they can get too far away from the crime scene. These quick responses have led to several arrests over the past year. The hard work of our well-trained officers and dispatchers makes these low response times possible.

Changes in legislation and voter initiated propositions have caused cities across the State and in Orange County to see a increase in crime. La Palma is not immune to these increases. Therefore, when our Officers are not responding to emergency calls or writing reports, they maximize their time patrolling La Palma neighborhoods to prevent and deter residential crimes.

These efforts have been successful throughout 2017, with La Palma Officers arresting a man after he brandished a firearm at a bank; capturing a wanted felon after a foot pursuit; arresting several armed suspects during traffic stops; arresting a parolee at large; seizing over 15,000 Xanax pills that were packaged for illegal sales; and arresting numerous suspects after vehicle pursuits. Our Detective Bureau has also been busy with identifying burglary suspects through a variety of investigative techniques and conducting surveillance to catch burglary suspects. La Palma detectives have also been working with the FBI and a multi-agency task force to investigate a multi-million dollar real estate scam.

By the end of the year, our officers will have arrested well over 300 suspects for various crimes, and over 30 of these arrests will be for DUI drivers. There were also numerous arrests for motor vehicle thefts, domestic violence, and other types of crimes. Our dispatchers will have handled over 25,000 phone calls this year with over 4,000 of those calls being 911 calls. In total, our Department will have handled over 16,000 incidents throughout the year.

The Police Department has also heavily focused on Community-Oriented Policing, and we have been involved with numerous community events and programs throughout the year. Our officers participated in the Red Ribbon Week Challenge, Police Interaction with Youth (P.I.Y.) program, Explorer program, and Volunteers in Policing (V.I.P.) program. With the help of the La Palma Community Foundation the

Department brought back the "Every 15 Minutes" program; and our officers hosted a "Tip-A-Cop" event to raise funds for the Special Olympics. Our Officers routinely work closely with all the local schools and we will enhance that partnership with implementation of the School Resource Officer program as mentioned on this page. I am very proud

of the service our Police Department employees provide to the community. Please have a safe and joyous New Year!

# 'Tis the Season for Package Theft

This is the season when many of us buy gifts over the internet and have the packages delivered to our homes. In prior years a number of La Palma residents have reported that their packages have been taken from their front doorstep. Package thieves routinely follow delivery trucks and observe the carriers delivering the packages and leaving them at the front door. If the package is left and the resident does not answer the door, the thieves have a green light to take the package and flee the area. The La Palma Police Department urges residents who are not

usually home to personally accept packages, to consider having packages delivered to a work address or held by the carrier. If you will not be present and the package must be delivered to your home, consider having a neighbor sign for the package and holding it for you. Although we do not recommend residents having their packages left unattended, you may request that the carriers leave them in areas not readily visible from the street. This may include near side doors, on porches away from street/sidewalk view, or other inconspicuous locations. Package delivery services will often honor requests to leave parcels in other areas of the home if properly requested. # **Holiday Closures & Service Schedules**

Since 2011, City staff have used floating holiday or other leave benefits to facilitate a winter holiday closure. To that end, all La Palma City offices (City Hall, Recreation, Public Works, and Police Administration) will be closed starting December 22 and will re-open on January 2. The Police Department is always open for emergency services or for other matters requiring an urgent response from the City, such as a water leak. Customers wishing to pay their municipal utility (water) bill during the holiday break are encouraged to use the drop-box, located outside City Hall or call Park Disposal (EDCO) directly at (714) 522-3577 and pay over the phone at no additional cost.

Trash collection services will be disrupted on November 23, December 25, and January 1, in observance of the holidays. Trash collection will be pushed back one day throughout these weeks; for example, Monday's collection will occur on Tuesday, Tuesday's collection on Wednesday, etc. During the two-week winter holiday period, Park Disposal will be using a separate collection truck to collect and recycle holiday trees.

Street sweeping services will be cancelled during the weeks of: Thanksgiving, Christmas, and New Years. Street sweeping services will resume on Monday, November 27 and then again on January 8. Please have a safe and joyous holiday season and Happy New Year from the City of La Palma!
